#### IMPACT100 WESTCHESTER





Our mission is to engage women in philanthropy and collectively fund transformational grants for nonprofit organizations serving Westchester.

#### **2022 HIGHLIGHTS**

As the pandemic persisted for a second year, we learned that we actually can CONNECT and EDUCATE remotely—members can travel and still join us for events and committee meetings—a different way from the past, but the process still works and often has improved participation! Whether remote or in person, our membership engages to TRANSFORM our community with grants.

#### **CONNECT**

- 287 members joined for our 9th cycle, including 46 new members and 9 members who came back after several years.
- Held an outdoor/in-person Meet & Mingle for new members; how nice to meet and welcome new members to the magic of Impact!
- Held two in-person Impact Xtra events for members and guests.
- Increased our social media posts and had a presence at the 914 Inc. Women in Business luncheon.
- Maintained our historical 75% member retention rate—one of the highest among other Impact100 Chapters.
- 164 members were engaged in one of our committees including Grant Review, Finance, and Focus Area.

#### **EDUCATE**

- Hosted 145 nonprofit representatives at our Fall Information Session to learn more about Impact100.
- Introduced new members to Impact through Information Sessions—we love to learn about our members and educate them about the power of transforming our community.
- Held two virtual Education Events: "You are a Philanthropist: The Power of Women's Giving" in the Fall and "Children's Mental Health" in the Spring. Over 200 members and guests participated in these events.

#### **TRANSFORM**

- Granting over \$285,000 to Westchester nonprofits this cycle.
- Over \$2,400,000 in total Grants awarded since 2013.
- Continuing our member chosen Focus Area Award category, 2022: Children's Mental Health.
- Our members generously contributed to a Thanksgiving-themed food drive organized by the Port Chester Carver Center and donated more than 100 holiday gifts to children through YWCA Yonkers.
- Our WishList continues to provide the opportunity for members to help our nonprofit partners with donation or volunteer opportunities.



## IMPACT100 WESTCHESTER

Our 9th grant cycle found us in a landscape similar to that of last cycle when COVID-19 spread across our community, affecting both our members and the Nonprofits that serve Westchester.

Although this year our committees continued to meet virtually, we are thrilled to be celebrating our Annual Meeting in person! We celebrate a cycle in which we continued our mission to award Transformational Project Grants. Each grant, whether Transformational Project or Core Mission, helps to achieve our goal of making stronger connections between our members and the Nonprofit community.

These awards make a difference in the lives of so many Westchester residents, continuing our commitment to "Give Where You Live."

In 9 years we have awarded over \$2,400,000 dollars to our Westchester community; a heartfelt thank you to all of our members, especially our Advisory, Finance, Focus Area and Grant Review Committees, for your patience and flexibility and your commitment to helping those in need.

#### **2022 GRANT CYCLE**

For our 2022 Grant Cycle, we are proud to have **287** members and will award **\$287,000!** 

Each year, the size of our grant fund is determined by the size of our combined membership donations. Grant finalists are selected via a membership-run review and evaluation process. Grantees are chosen by a vote of the full membership.

#### Tonight, we will award:

- \*2 Transformational Project Grants \$85,000 each
- **\***3 Core Mission Grants \$30,000 each

The two recipients with the highest number of votes will receive \$85,000 each to complete their project.

The Core Mission awards, given to the remaining 3 organizations, will be used in ANY manner that the Nonprofits feel is consistent with fulfilling their Core Mission. These flexible, unrestricted awards should support the principles that guide the organization's vision, culture, and overall philosophy.

#### IMPACTIOO WESTCHESTER



The Impact100 model of women's collective giving originated in Cincinnati in 2001 when Wendy Steele mobilized 100 friends and business associates to each donate \$1,000 to promote collective philanthropy among women.

To date, over \$105 million has been awarded by Impact100 groups worldwide to fund local needs. Currently there are over 60 Impact100 chapters including Australia and the UK.

Impact100 Westchester was founded in 2012 by Sharon Salomy Douglas. Inspired by her college friend who was affiliated with Impact100 Philadelphia, Sharon's enthusiasm for bringing women's collective giving to Westchester led to the first Impact100 Westchester grant cycle with 132 members.

In this, our 9th cycle, we will exceed \$2,400,000!!!



#### **2021-22 HANDS-ON PROJECTS**

#### **LOOK WHAT WE DID!**

Our Hands-On initiative provides different one-off opportunities for our members to engage with our nonprofit partners.

This community service is a win for both the nonprofit community we support and for Impact100 Westchester members.



Thanksgiving is a time to give thanks and gather round a table to share a meal.

Our members helped families served by Port Chester Carver Center by donating to the nonprofits' annual fall holiday food drive. Members generously contributed from a list of Thanksgiving favorites as well as other items such as mac and cheese, pasta, canned fruits and vegetables and cookies.

Our members helped to make holiday wishes come true for children at programs run by the YWCA Yonkers.

Selecting from a curated "Amazon Custom Gift List", our members played Santa to children from newborn to age 18 and donated over 100 gifts that were delivered straight to the Y for distribution.

The Impact 100 Hands-On Committee was especially delighted to organize a diverse panel of Impact 100 members to present interview techniques, resume building tips, and career advancement advice to Hudson Link alumni in various stages of professional development.







#### **2021 CORE MISSION AWARDS**



#### HOPE'S DOOR - \$26,500

Seeks to end domestic violence and to empower survivors to achieve safety, independence, and healing from the trauma of abuse. The Impact100 unrestricted grant funds supported the agency as a whole, which benefitted all of those we served in the past year.

Impact100 funds were used to support the following:

- COVID-related Expenses: This included hotel fees, food costs for those sheltered in hotels, and testing kits.
- Technology: Expenses related to EmpowerDb, text, and chat costs.
- Adopt-a-Room: Shelter makeover expenses not covered by volunteers and donors.
- Unfunded personnel costs for staff.



#### **PORT CHESTER CARVER CENTER - \$26,500**

"You will be delighted to know that another female philanthropist was also very excited about our application. #### THE STEM ALLIANCE - \$26,500

Thanks to critical funding from Impact100, The STEM Alliance's *Digital Equity Now* program has provided wraparound digital inclusion services to over 70 clients across Westchester in the last 6 months. Impact 100's funding is helping to bridge the "digital divide," a social inequity that limits equal access to digital tools for education, job skills, banking, healthcare and social services. Combining device access with education, the STEM Alliance ensures that clients will not just have tech access but become tech "adopters," using their skills to participate in our digitally driven society.

One participant, returning to his community following incarceration said, "I just came out of fifteen years in prison and no one gave us these skills. I'm going to have to learn a lot more, but these are the skills that I know I need."



#### **WESTCHESTER MEDICAL CENTER - \$26,500**

We have not been immune to the nationwide challenge of Nursing Recruitment and Retention. This has led to obstacles in getting staff to volunteer to accept the training and time to start the program. Finding training sites for clinical practice has also been an issue due to post COVID precautions. We have a resource on site, the Child Abuse Pediatric Team, who will open their program up to interviewing and examination of pediatric sexual abuse cases. This will be an excellent education for all RN Examiners in training.

Two RNs have completed the SANE-A (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner – Adult) training didactic course and are signing up for the SANE-P (Pediatric) didactic course. Three RN candidates are in line to complete the SANE-A Training via online learning courses. They will then work with the Child Abuse Pediatric Team, as described.

Preparing professional RNs for this type of exam is a long process. This grant has made a significant impact to this program. It has also given great hope for a new generation of examiners to carry this critical intervention into the near future.
